







#### Basis: Published overviews of population registers

- But: can these registers in practice be used for survey sampling?
  - Lack of publications



# Which country teams use a population register?







Mixed frame use: Austria, Estonia, Germany, Netherlands, Spain, Czech Republic, Finland, France, Italy, Luxembourg, and Poland






possibility to jointly build and share sampling frames here


Joint effort to improve accessibility here?








# Who has access to the used registers?
